

LAREDO 2 Guide - Indianapolis, IN

LAREDO 2 clinics are designed to enhance understanding of 2-person mechanics and establish a strong foundation in effective game management techniques. Officials are instructed in a classroom session by at least two clinicians who are some of the most respected educators in the lacrosse officiating community. The bulk of the clinic is field evaluations where the clinicians give actionable feedback during and after each game. This gives each official multiple opportunities to refine their mechanics and develop new skills.
